

# MAKE YOUR OWN BIRD NEST BALLS!



## WHAT IS IT?

A **Bird Nest Ball** is filled with natural materials that birds can use to make their nests.

## WHY DOES IT MATTER?

When neighborhoods are built, bird habitat is lost. Providing nesting material is an important part of making a bird-friendly yard.

## WE NEED BIRDS!

- Just like bees and butterflies, over 900 species of birds are pollinators
- Insect-eating birds protect our trees and flowers
- Birds distribute seeds far and wide
- Birdwatching is a popular outdoor hobby, both in the backyard and in nature





# **BIRD NEST BALL INFO SHEET**

You may need to refill your bird nest ball as birds use the material to build their nests. When replacing materials remember:

#### DO Use:

- ✓ Any Natural Materials
- ✓ Pet Hair
- ✓ Feathers
- ✓ 100% Cotton String/Yarn
- ✓ Moss
- ✓ Lichen
- ✓ Natural Sisal
- ✓ Small twigs
- ✓ Pieces of Grapevine
- ✓ Grass clippings or dead grass
- ✓ Cattails

#### **DO NOT Use:**

- X Synthetic String
- X Plastic!!!
- X Dryer Lint
- X Any non-natural fibers
- X Large/heavy items
- **X** Bark

#### **Timing and Storage**

- •Store filled nest balls in a cool, dry place
- Birds usually begin nesting starting in early Spring
- Nest balls can be reused

### Where can I place my nest ball?

- o Hang it on a limb
- o Put it in a bush or shrub
- Hang it on your porch or on a wreath

**Note**: Be mindful that larger birds might need a place to land while using the ball.

#### Want to make more?

- o For this bird nest ball, we wrapped about 3.5 feet of 18-gauge craft wire around a racquet ball.
- You can also use....
  - o An onion bag
  - o Grapevine ball
  - Suet Feeder
- O Stuffing material in a bush or tree is also helpful
- Make sure that the openings are large enough for birds to access the materials inside
